Government Purchase Card (GPC) is the preferred method for purchasing and paying for goods and services under the micro-purchase threshold.

- Agency SBPs serves as a liaison between you and Contracting Officer/Program Manager
- Only contact Contracting/Program Office when directed
- Posture yourself for renewal on recurring acquisition
 - Consider Teaming arrangement





- Federal Contract Opportunities (SAM.gov): <u>www.beta.SAM.gov</u>
 - Federal agencies are required to use this site to communicate available procurement opportunities and their vendor requirements to the public and interested potential vendors for all contracts valued over \$25,000

System for Award Management (SAM): www.sam.gov

SAM is the new registration portal for contractor registration and business registrations. This has replaced and combined any former platforms. All vendors looking to do business with the Federal Government must have an active registration in SAM. There is no cost associated with using and/or registering in SAM.

Federal Procurement Data System (FPDS): <u>www.fpds.gov</u>

Continue using FPDS eZsearch for details on specific contracts. FPDS remains the authoritative source for entering and viewing details about contract award data.

A wealth of information and resources related to the various programs and assistance the SBA provides to small businesses.

Assists in understanding various agencies and small business policies; Can be used as a reference for clauses in your contract
